### FROM THE PRESIDENT

The time is fast approaching for another great time – the annual get-together of the Topeka Reunion Association -- this year in Portland, Ore.

While reading up on some of the history of Portland I ran across a couple of things that some of you might be interested in. The Oregon Museum of Science and Industry is a nice place to visit. You can explore hands-on exhibits in five exhibit halls and eight science labs, classes. Learning is enhanced by computer games, science laboratories and simulations, where visitors can touch a tornado, experience an earthquake or jump on the Internet.

The 330-seat OMNIMAX theater features a large movie projector, a five-story domed screen and a state-of-the art sound system. Planetarium and Laser shows are shown daily; and the price is \$7.00 (\$5.00 for old guys like me).

The USS Blueback, last diesel-electric submarine built by the Navy, is docked outside the museum, and is open for tours. Decommissioned in 1990, it was used in the filming of "The Hunt for Red October."

## REUNION CITIES/ COORDINATORS.

This year, we will be selecting a city/coordinator for the 2004 reunion (Eastern U.S.) and selecting a city/coordinator for the 2005 reunion (Central U.S.).

Cities proposed for 2004 include Tampa, Fla. (Chuck Northrup), Baltimore, Md. (Ernie Villamil), Charleston, SC (Max Kaster) and New York City (Ray and Kathy Spatz). Members indicated will present information supporting their proposal at the Portland Reunion Business Meeting, and a site will be selected by vote.

Members present may propose cities in the Central U.S. for the 2005 reunion. Mike Phillips indicated at the Denver reunion that he would like to propose Minneapolis, MN for the 2005 reunion. Remember, the goal is to sell the city and what it has to offer to the membership, and that the person successful in selling his city assumes the role of Coordinator for that reunion.

The desired sequence of events is that 2 years prior to a reunion, a prospective coordinator will be at the reunion to "sell" the membership on the city he is proposing. That is, explain to the membership what his city has to offer that would make them choose that city. Implicit with the selection of his city, that person assumes the role of reunion coordinator.

During the next year, he will do the "leg-work" to plan the reunion, select the hotel, choose tours, etc., lay out the schedule of events, using the association's "Reunion Guide" to assist him in his preparations.

At one year before the reunion, the coordinator will present his plan for the reunion to the Board. Once approved, he will proceed to fill in all the details, getting timely information to the President, and the Newsletter Editor, etc. The Secretary/Treasurer, and the Caterer, will assist him in contractual matters with the hotel, tour companies, etc.

## Portland 2003 Reunion Highlights

**Reunion Dates:** Wednesday, August 13, 2003 through Saturday, August 16, 2003, with most folks departing on Sunday August 17, 2003. **Please send your Reunion Registration forms in early.**

**Hotel: Doubletree Hotel Portland ~Lloyd Center.** 1000 NE Multnomah St., Portland, OR 97232-2163. Sleeping Room Rates are \$88.00 Standard; \$93 Premium (for single or double occupancy); \$269 Lanai Suite; \$465 Parlor Suite. Additional persons are \$10. The quoted rates are quoted exclusive of prevailing local lodging tax, currently 11.5%. Quoted rates will be offered, based on availability, to our attendees three days before August 12 and three days after August 16, 2003. Individual parking Day Fee is \$5 per day or \$2 per hour, which ever is less. Overnight parking fee is \$10 per day for overnight guests.

**Make Your Own Hotel Reservations.** The Doubletree Hotel Portland~Lloyd Center's **Deadline for reservations is Wednesday, July 23, 2003.** To receive the contracted rates, identify yourself as being with the USS Topeka (CLG-8) Reunion Association. All reservations will be guaranteed with individual credit cards. In the event of a no show, one night's room and tax will be posted to that credit card. **Early departure fee:** In the event a guest who has reserved a room within our reserved block of rooms check's out prior to the guest's reserved checkout date, the hotel will add an early departure fee of \$50. To avoid an early departure fee, guests should advise the hotel before or upon check-in of any change of their departure date. The hotel will inform all guests of the early departure fee at registration.

**Phone Number for Registrations: call 1-800-996-0510 and ask for USS Topeka (CLG-8) Reunion Association.** Check-in time is 3 PM local time; checkout is 12 noon. The Doubletree Hotel Portland Lloyd Center is in the perfect location, in the center of the city, just blocks from the Oregon Convention Center, the Rose Garden Arena and Memorial Coliseum. The Hotel is 9 miles from the Portland International Airport. Drive time is 20 minutes. The fifteen story hotel offers 476 beautifully appointed guest rooms and suites with quality amenities and views of downtown Portland or the Cascade Mountain Range. The Hotel offers two excellent restaurants, the Multnomah Grill and Eduardo's Mexican Grill and Cantina. The hotel is conveniently located within walking distance of the Oregon Convention Center, Rose Garden Arena and MAX light rail system (1 block away), which provides free transportation to most downtown locations. The MAX light rail system provides excellent airport transportation for only \$1.55 per person one way.
